Lucknow admin to set up kiosks for distribution of Ivermectin tablets

Lucknow's district administration will set up around 40 kiosks across the city to ensure free distribution of Ivermectin tablets among asymptomatic Covid-19 patients. A few of these kiosks will become operational from Monday, officials said.

Ivermectin, a deworming drug, can be used as a supporting medicine for Covid-19 patients under home isolation and their contacts, according to doctors.

Officials said the kiosks would come up at the airport, city bus stations, railway stations, etc.

Additional district magistrate KP Singh said, "The use of the Ivermectin tablet has proved effective for asymptomatic Covid-19 patients. It is also being widely prescribed by government doctors. Hence, the administration, in collaboration with the health department, is setting up kiosks across the city to ensure its free distribution."

Officials said the project would be implemented in phases.

"Initially, all the entry and exit points of the city would be covered. It would largely include all four bus stations, railway stations, the airport and the highway entries and exits," an official said. Experts would ensure distribution of tablets among the people at all these points, he said. The tablets would be given on the basis of the symptoms or if anyone has come in contact with a Covid-19 patient.

On Wednesday, chief medical officer (Lucknow) Dr RP Singh issued a circular, advising people to take Ivermectin tablet, as per their body weight and age, if they test positive and are under home isolation.

Doctors said the medicine was found effective against the virus in a lab in-vitro study.

"In Australia, researchers claimed the viral load went down 5,000 times in 48 hours with this medicine taken in combination. Also, a Bangladesh scientist claimed a similar effect. At present, research on this medicine is going on at 28 places," said Dr Kauser Usman of King George's Medical University.

"It is not a treatment for Covid-19, but yes, as a supporting medicine, its role has been identified to boost immunity. It can be taken under a doctor's guidance for a proper dosage," said Dr PK Gupta, former president of the Indian Medical Association, Lucknow. 26.9.2021 India Today

"Why HCQ and Ivermectin were removed from India's Covid-19 treatment protocol"

Ivermectin and HCQ were dropped from the clinical guidance after studies found that these drugs have little to no effect on Covid-related mortality or clinical recovery of the patient.

Studies have found that HCQ and Ivermectin have little to no effect on Covid-related mortality or clinical recovery of the patient.

The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and the National Task Force on Covid-19 have dropped the use of Ivermectin and Hydroxychloroquine (HCQ) drugs from their revised guidelines for the treatment of the infection.

The decision was taken after experts found that these drugs have little to no effect on Covid-related mortality or clinical recovery of the patient.

"HCQ may be considered for removal from guideline, with recommendation to use with caution only in clinical trial setting (since there is some genuine uncertainty regarding the possible benefit for severe cases and in low dose)," said the document titled 'considerations for exclusion of Ivermectin and Hydroxychloroquine from the clinical guidance for management of adult Covid-19 patients'.

Several clinical studies have shown the low mortality benefit for HCQ, said the document. In fact, when HCQ is administered with azithromycin, it increases the risk of adverse drug effect (ADE) in patients, experts said.

Studies also found there was no clarity on mortality benefit, no effect on length of hospital stay and recovery in case of Ivermectin.

Recommending that Ivermectin be dropped from the clinical guidance, experts cited 13 systematic reviews of which "7/13 showed mortality benefit, 4/13 no mortality benefit, 2/13 inconclusive/unclear."

Additionally, there was a high risk of bias in many of the studies, particularly with the ones showing mortality benefit, as the level of certainty is low in them.

The recommendations were made at a meeting of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) and the ICMR national task force for Covid-19 and the Joint Monitoring Group on August 20.

Meanwhile, cautioning that the upcoming festival season is a critical period, AIIMS-Delhi Director Dr Randeep Guleria said the next 6-8 weeks are going to be critical and the community has to come together to ensure people follow all Covid norms and aggressively encourage vaccination.

While the number of new Covid-19 cases are steadily declining across the country, the Union Health Ministry has advised states and UTs to keep a strict vigil as the country is still in the midst of the second surge of the pandemic.

Uttar Pradesh chief minister Yogi Aditynath on Tuesday flagged off vehicles carrying medical kits to be distributed among children with Covid -19 symptoms across the state. In a special drive aimed to protect children in various age groups from the pandemic, the state government will distribute 50 lakh medical kits through village surveillance committees, said an official release. State health and family welfare department's additional chief secretary Amit Mohan Prasad said the medical kits contain paracetamol tablets, ORS packets, multi – vitamins and Ivermectin tablets to be administered to symptomatic children in the interim, till their samples are tested for coronavirus following their admission to a health care facility if found positive. Medicines supplied in the kits can also be used to treat seasonal fever, he said.

"The kit has been prepared based on the suggestions given by medical experts and paediatricians," Prasad said.

UP Medical Supply Corporation Limited has prepared separate kits for four age groups: Infants (0-1 year), 1-5 years, 5-12 years and 12-18 years. Infants and children up to 5 years will only be given drops, syrups and liquid medicines. The kits do not contain any antibiotics, which will only be given at the primary health centers on producing a doctor's prescription, said Prasad.

In the first phase, the vehicles flagged off by the CM will transport 17 lakh medical kits to 75 districts, and later, 33 lakh medical kits will be transported to warehouses set up in various districts for further distribution as per need basis, he added.

In all the 75 districts, a team of doctors under the chairmanship of the district's chief medical officer (CMO) will supervise the administration of doses as well as distribution of the medical kits among the children. Frontline health workers including- Accredited Social Health Activist (Asha), Auxiliary Nursing Midwives (ANM) and Anganwadi workers will visit each household to collect details of sick children and distribute medicines.

"The district health department will send a rapid response team to collect samples of children with Covid-19 symptoms. Those found positive will be admitted to the nearby primary or community health centres for treatment," Prasad added.

He said that the state government has also planned to set up 100 beds in paediatric intensive care units in each district hospital and state-run medical college in preparation to shield children from a possible third wave of the pandemic. The department will also set up 25 beds neonatal intensive care units in each district hospital and medical college, he added.

The number of daily cases of coronavirus disease (Covid-19) have been on a downswing in Uttar Pradesh. In the last 24 hours, no new case was identified in 59 of the state's 75 districts, according to UP a government release. Moreover, recoveries continue to outnumber new cases in the state. Out of the 1,91,446 samples tested in the last 24 hours, 33 samples tested positive for the Covid-19 infection and as a result the Test Positivity Rate (TPR) slumped to lower than 0.01 per cent in Uttar Pradesh, the state government data showed.

In the same period, 25 patients recovered from the infection. The active caseload in the country's most populous state has been reduced to 187 from a high of 3,10,783 in April, pushing the recovery rate up to 98.7 per cent, the state government said in a release.

The state government's turnaround has been appreciated globally. Australian MP Jason Wood heaped praises on chief minister Yogi Adityanath for effectively managing the Covid-19 outbreak in the state. He also expressed desire of working with UP government. <u>statements</u>

"Many thanks to Hon. CM of UP Yogi Adityanath for his kind message to me. We look forward to working with U.P. Government for enrichment of culture and development. Appreciate UP Government's Covid control efforts in this difficult time," Wood wrote on Twitter on Tuesday.

The key parts of UP government's plan to tackle Covid-19 included contact tracing, early detection, isolation and free and timely provision of medicine kits and treatment to the rural populace.

In June, Australia's federal independent Member of Parliament Craig Kelly had praised Uttar Pradesh for successfully "smashing" the "scary" Delta variant of Covid-19.

Patrick Brauckmann, a Canadian Investor, also lauded the UP model of Covid management in July, referring to the effective leadership of Yogi Adityanath in "crushing the curve".
